I have noticed comments online claiming Microsoft handed me a cease-and-desist. While I enjoy the humour of this narrative, I should clear my name. As the end of my writing drew nearer, I found *lulu.com* to have the easiest method of distributing the book to fellow Halo fans. At Lulu, there are two options: "Print your book" and "Publish your book". I clicked on the latter option because it seemed that would allow more Halo fans to find Halo Array. I realised the book could not be provided for free as it would cost money to physically print and ship a copy. I carried through with the "Publish" option, however, as I figured the prices would be laid out clearly (for printing and shipping accordingly) wherever the book would go on to appear – meaning no money would be made on the content of the book.

During this process, I realised I could 'cut out the middleman' and simply provide the files and instructions for people to print Halo Array themselves rather than accessing any third-party websites. I switched to this method and, somewhere along the way, assumed I'd cancelled the "Publish your book" option.

After receiving a copy of my book, I shared Halo Array online via a Reddit post. In the comments, other Reddit users informed me that Halo Array had in fact gone to third-party websites. Initially I figured, because I was making no money from these, it shouldn't matter. However, upon inspection, I found the books were being sold for whatever price the third-party websites wished, which in hindsight, I suppose makes sense. The third-party websites had added their own prices onto the book. I went back into Lulu and cancelled the "Publish your book" option (by my own choosing), stripping Halo Array from all third-party sites.

Anyway, as you can see below, I made no money from Halo Array, and I never once intended to. :)
